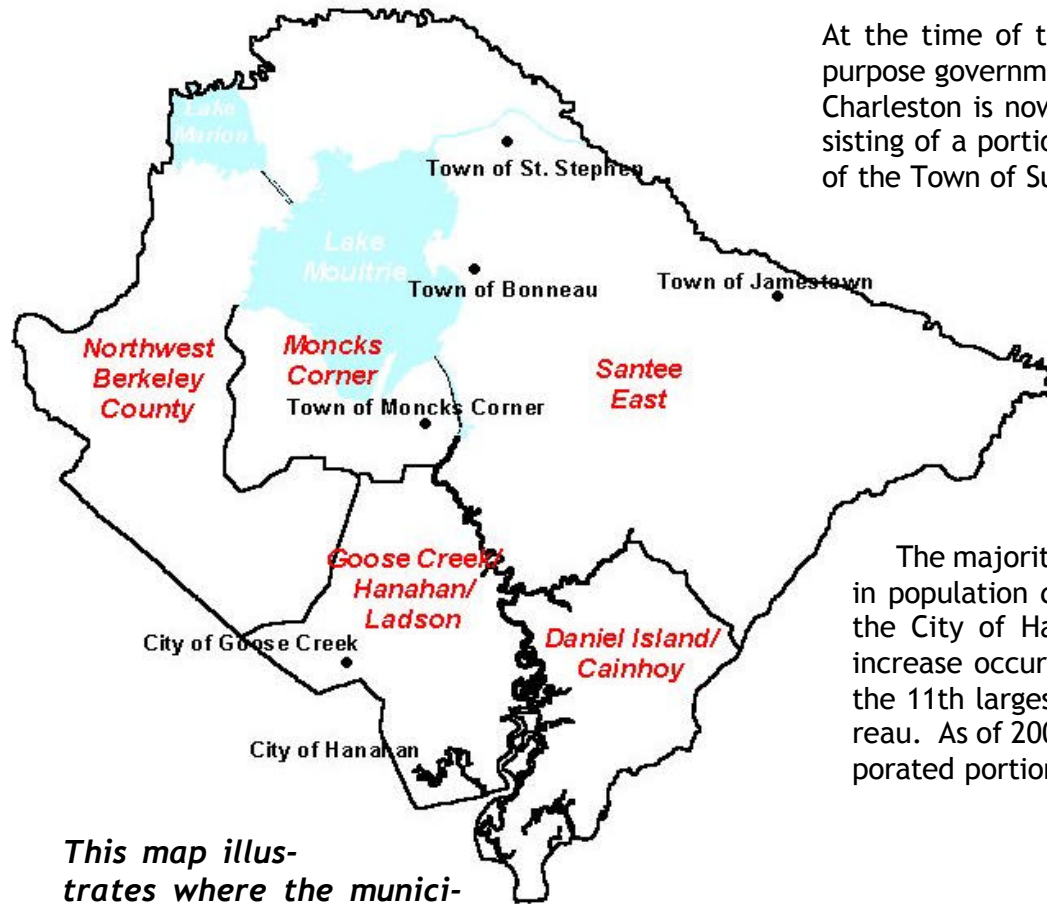


Incorporated Places



This map illustrates where the municipalities and Planning Areas in Berkeley County are located.

At the time of the 2000 Census, there were six municipal general purpose governments located in Berkeley County. Part of the City of Charleston is now located within the Berkeley County borders, consisting of a portion of Daniel Island and the Cainhoy Peninsula. Part of the Town of Summerville is also located in Berkeley County.

The growth of a municipality is not only a function of townspeople having children and new residents moving in from elsewhere; cities may also expand through annexation of adjoining property which enlarges the municipal boundaries.

The majority of the municipalities in Berkeley County increased in population during the 1990's. Only the Town of Bonneau and the City of Hanahan lost population. The greatest population increase occurred in the City of Goose Creek, which was ranked the 11th largest municipality in South Carolina by the Census Bureau. As of 2000, there were 61,646 persons living in the unincorporated portion (outside of cities and towns) of Berkeley County.
