

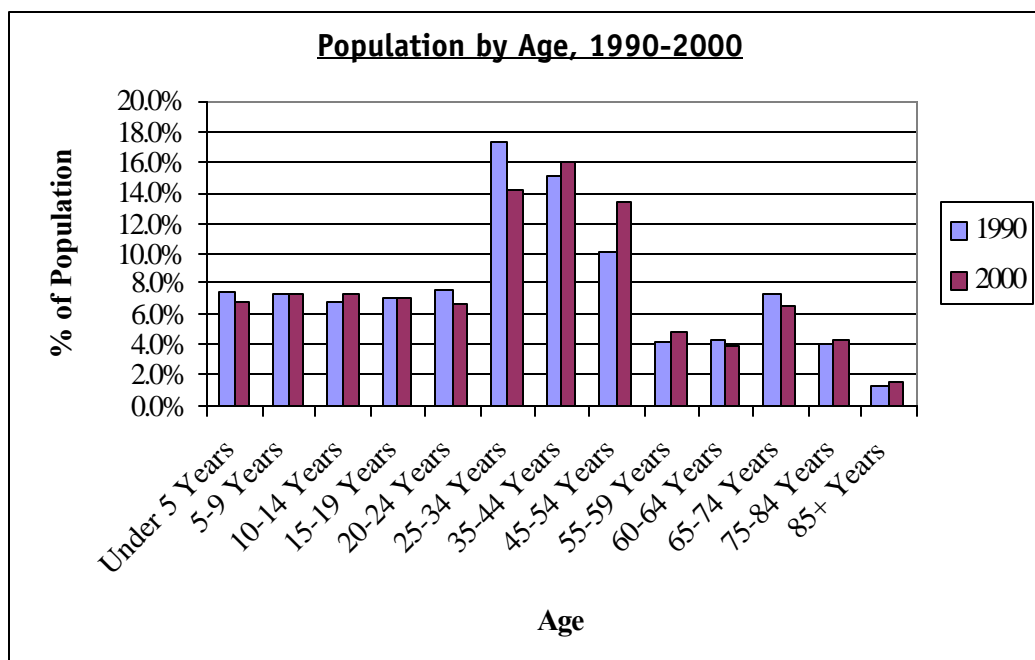

The population of the nation increased more than 13 percent between 1990 and 2000. The female population of the nation outnumbered the male population by approximately 5.3 million people, although it grew at a slower rate than the male population. The only age brackets that experienced population loss included the 20 to 24 years, 25 to 34 years, and the 35 to 44 years age groups. Both the 85 years and older and 65 years and older populations increased at much higher rates than the population of children under the age of 5. The percent of the population under the age of 18, as well as the percent of population over the age of 18, remained relatively constant during the 1990's, at 25.6 percent and 74.4 percent, respectively.

The median age of the nation increased by 2.4 years to 35.3 years in 2000.

The total number of households in the U.S. increased by almost 15 percent during the 1990's. The number of married couple households, children in households, and family households also increased. The household composition of the nation changed during the 1990's with the rise in numbers of other relatives and nonrelatives in households, unmarried partner households, and the increase in the number of female householders with no husband present.

The average household and family sizes declined slightly, as did the number of persons per owner and renter occupied units. Both the homeowner and rental vacancy rates declined during the last decade.
